Cutting Loose Your Sandbags

As a new officer I attended the Key Club convention in Green Bay this past March. Among different workshops and getting to know Key Clubbers from all over Wisconsin and Upper Michigan, there was a motivational speaker. The term motivational speaker makes Scott Greenberg's speeches sound non-beneficial to anyone who is happy with how his or her life is going. However, once he starts talking you easily forget that opinion. At his workshop he gave a speech about how we can be like hot air balloons. Everyone can do great things and soar to great heights, but lots of us have things holding us down. Scott described the things that hold us back as sandbags. Most people have three major sandbags: appearance interference, "the mental heckler," and fear of being uncomfortable. Appearance interference sandbags are the things that hold you back because you are worried about what other people will think about you. No one wants others to judge him or her. Scott's solution was, don't let them judge you. You can be the judge, not the suspect. While it sounds simple, it will take some work. The next sandbag was called "the mental heckler." This is the small voice in the back of your mind that "cuts" on you and brings out all of your insecurities. You should know that this voice is *always* wrong! The key to blocking out the opinions of the mental heckler is this, you don't have to stop your insecurities, just don't let them stop you. The last sandbag is the fear of moving out of your comfort zone. Getting success means that you are going to have to take risks and that you may not succeed the first time, but don't let that stop you from trying again. Keep in mind that courage doesn't mean you don't have fear, it means that you have fear but go for it anyway. So next time you have a chance to do something amazing, remember to cut loose your sandbags and go for it!

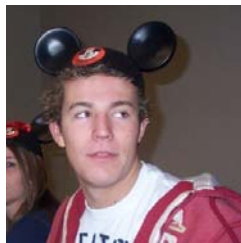
District Secretary-Emily Hoffmann

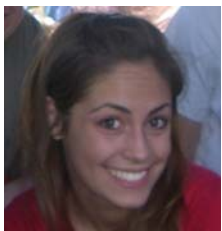
Assistant District Administrator-Michael “Fitz” Fitzpatrick

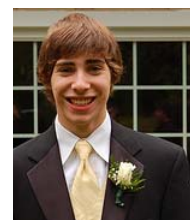
Division 1 Lieutenant Governor-Dana Calamia

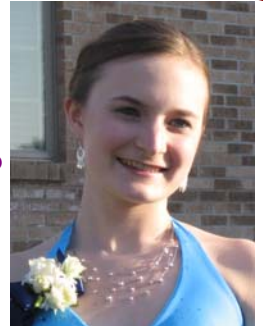

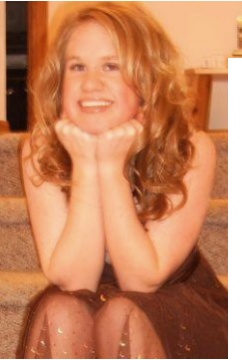
Division 6 Lieutenant Governor-Brittany Springer

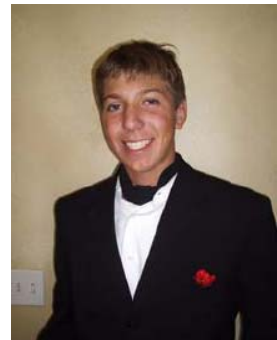
Division 7 Lieutenant Governor-Emily Mulloy
