Governor's Project

Governor's Project

Over the past six months, my sophomore class has undertaken a project that reaches out to shut-ins in the community. For our purposes, a shut-in was defined as most likely an elderly person who does not leave their house much if at all, participates in only a few social events per week, or perhaps does not have many family members in town. We were then charged with the task of reaching out to these shut-ins through monthly visits lasting at least two hours in which we would talk to them about their history, learn about how things are going for them, or play a board game or cards. In the case that they were disabled, we would also help them out around the house from shoveling snow to helping them do dishes.

The particular shut-ins that my group (which consisted of a friend, my sister, and me) chose were a couple who lived three houses down the street named Charlie and Gary. Just a couple of weeks before we undertook this project, Charlie had been diagnosed with ALS (a condition similar to Lou Gehrig's disease that attacks the nervous system and eventually renders one's body useless). For the first two or three months, the project was pretty straightforward, even with the disease, with my group visiting the couple once a month for two hours in which we talked about their lives and played a game here and there.

As the ALS progressed, however, Charlie's condition degraded to the point where she had to be moved into hospice care. Our visits to her were no longer two hours. In fact, we were lucky if she did not tire before 45 minutes. It became harder for her to do even simple tasks like talk on the phone, change the channel, or eat.

On April 5th, 2009, Charlie passed away. Even though my entire sophomore service project group knew this had been coming, as did all those around Charlie, it was still a moment that gave me pause.

As the funeral proceedings commenced according to how Charlie had wished them to be carried out, my sister and I were asked to have the honor of reading the letters from Charlie's sister and son at the funeral. At this point, I knew that our mere visits and assistance over the past few months had been more than a few visits and good deeds to Charlie.

What gave me cause for even greater reflection, however, was when my sister, mom, and I were thanked in Charlie's sister's letter for the help that we had provided her with over the past several months. To be thanked so publicly in such an intimate setting for our seemingly small role in her life opened my eyes to how simply visiting someone and being that bright, cheery person can have a profound effect on that person's life; how shoveling snow on the coldest day of the year can warm a person's heart; how the things that we do every day that appear meaningless to us can really mean the world to someone else.

Therefore, I chose to focus my 2009-2010 Governor's Project on reaching out to shut-ins in communities with the hope that this project will touch at least one life in the way that my group's visitations clearly touched Charlie. Each Key Club is encouraged to identify at least one shut-in in their community and develop at least a monthly schedule of visiting this person for 4 months. This year's Governor's Project competition will then be focused around creating a creative "snapshot" of that person's life through a scrapbook, interview, or even short video – whatever you feel is most creative! Your Lt. Governor will have more information in the near future about this project, but I encourage you to start thinking about it today!

He was born and raised in Jamaica and eventually joined Jamaica's first Olympic bobsled team which, despite coming from a tropical region, did surprisingly well in their debut during the 1988 Winter Olympics. After the keynote speaker, Key Clubbers participated in many fun workshops and learned all about service and leadership. We also elected our new district board for the 2009-2010 year. Short introductions from everyone on the new board can be found from pages six to eleven in this newsletter. At DCON, many Key Clubbers and their clubs also received many awards. These included scrap booking, video/poster, impromptu essay, talent, and oratorical awards as well as more service-oriented ones like distinguished clubs and club officers.

Of course, along with business, DCON was a TON of fun! I can honestly say that the DJ Key Club rents every year for our nightly dances is one of the best that I've ever seen/heard. The first dance was one that featured each division's own musical theme, and the second one was a neon themed dance. A few creative Key Clubbers even came in neon colored duct tape dresses! That weekend went by so fast! By the end of those three days, just about everyone was exhausted, but also disappointed to be leaving so soon. 


Division 8 LTG


Division 12 LTG


Division 21 LTG
