



What is the District Project?

The District Project is raising funds for Baycliff Health Camp in Upper Michigan and Camp Wawbeek in Wisconsin. This Cookbook is filled with fun ways to get involved with the camps and help out!



Fundraisers - Sporting Events

Bake Sale - I know with new laws that this could be hard to do during school hours but there are other options such as sporting events! All you need are some parents and students willing to donate food, and people's sweet tooth will do the rest!

Sport Tournament - A fun way to make money and get your school involved is by hosting a sporting tournament such as volleyball or dodgeball. All you need are team forms, an entry fee, and brackets. You can also go to local businesses and ask if they would be willing to donate money to the cause or prizes for the winning teams!

Miracle Minute - Miracle Minutes are a great way to raise money in a short amount of time - sixty seconds! During half time at sporting events, make an announcement about the Miracle Minute and have runners go around the bleachers with boxes or bags to collect money. You simply add up the money after the minute, and announce the total at the end of the game!

Fundraisers - In Class

Penny Wars - This is an easy and cost friendly fundraiser. Put a jar in every classroom and have the classrooms compete to see who can raise the most money. There is a catch though. Anything that isn't a penny subtracts money from the total amount a class has raised. For example, if someone from another class puts a dollar into your jar, you now have to make up for that by putting one hundred pennies into the jar. You can even have them competing for doughnuts or a pizza party. The reward will create fun competition but will also get people fired up to win! Let the war begin.

Gift Basket Raffle - Go around town and see if businesses will donate gift cards or prizes and make baskets out of them. Set them up in your school's office and then put on your announcements that tickets to win a basket are a dollar or two. Have the raffle go on for about a week and then pick a winner. You can also do this at big events to raise more money and awareness.



Fundraisers - In the Community

Hot Dog Stand - Find a local grocery store that is willing to let you set up a hot dog stand outside their store. Sometimes they will provide the food for you, but other times you have to provide the food. If you advertise this event around your town a week or two before the event, you should definitely have a good turn out; especially since grocery shopping makes everyone hungry!

Pancake Dinner - Pancakes are easy to make and many people love them which makes them a great fundraiser. All that you need are a few electric griddles, pancake batter, syrup, and a place with some space. You could sell tickets for the event and/or charge people at the door. This event can become an even bigger event if you advertise throughout the community.



Fundraisers - Competitions

Board Game Tournament - Choose a fun game that everyone might know such as Sorry, Monopoly, Clue, or Trouble. This could be a team event where they get points for the team, or have it be a single player event. Have an entry fee and a prize for the winner. Also, there could be a time limit so the games run smoothly and they are on time.

Car Smash - Contact your local junk yards and see if they could donate a car with its body and windows mostly intact. You could paint rival school colors on it and charge \$2 a swing with a hammer. Make sure the proper safety precautions are made and that you have safety glasses and protective outerwear. Now swing away!
